Current situation



EU by 2020: Halt Biodiversity loss

- Natura 2000: Europe's nature protection network
- Biodiversity conservation on <u>private land</u>?
 - Engagement of private landowners is required
 - In most EU Member States: voluntary programs supporting land owners in participating nature conservation management







Examples of conservation incentives and tools

- New Flemish Nature legislation: Subsidies and Tax benefits
 - One single legislation and application procedure for all types of nature and all types of owners
- Wildlife Estate Label
 - Public recognition
- Information and on-the-ground <u>support</u> programs

- → Lack of awareness of existing and programs
- → Lack of programs in some National/Regional/European laws and policies





Overall project objective



- Expand the use of private land conservation methods and approaches in the EU
- Develop recommendations for new and more effective private land conservation policies changes, administrative regulations, guidelines, funding, incentives, capacity needs,...
- Develop a Network of European Private landowners involved in nature conservation
